Besides him, Bishop Spalding had secured eight other volunteers. They were Fathers Bekkers, Luytelaar, Wuyts, Van Deutekom, Chazal, Van Emstrede, De Vries and Bax. The party sailed for America from Havre, France, April 25, 1853, on one of the first transatlantic steamers, and reached New York in twelve days, quick time for those days.
